REACH - Regulation (EC) 1907/2006

Dear Sir or Madam,

We refer to the required declaration and hereby inform you as follows:

Your inquiry refers to Article 33 of the REACH Regulation. In order for B.E.G. to provide you with a legally binding statement, we will contact all of our suppliers and inquire about the SVHC status (candidate list, "substances of very high concern"). Suppliers will be asked about the presence of SVHC candidate substances contained in a concentration of more than 0.1% by weight. They will be asked to provide B.E.G. with sufficient information. Accordingly, they must at least disclose the name of the substance and how its safe handling can be ensured.

Based on the information provided by our suppliers, we have entered the data into the SCIP database provided by the European Chemicals Agency (ECHA). We have passed on the information in accordance with Article 33 of the REACH Regulation in the context of the supply chain. You are welcome to access this data via the portal. If you need our assistance in doing so, we will be happy to help.

Our suppliers must continue to inform us unsolicited if the products or sub-products they supply contain (at least) one SVHC substance in a concentration of more than 0.1% by weight. We always report this information (and further details) to the ECHA immediately and in a timely manner as part of SCIP. Even though SCIP is perceived as "massive bureaucracy," we have decided to take this route. The list of over 200 SVHC substances ("substances of very high concern") can be found on the ECHA website. It is expanded by a few substances approximately every six months.

With regard to the reports to ECHA, we confirm at this point in time that none of the products we supply contain any substances listed in Article 59 of Regulation (EC) No. 1907/2006 in a concentration exceeding 0.1% by weight.
