RoHS EU Directive 2011/65/EU and amendment 2015/863/EU

Dear Madam or Sir,

We refer to the required declaration and hereby inform you of the following:

Your inquiry refers to the restriction on the use of certain hazardous substances in electrical and electronic equipment in accordance with Directive 201165/EU. This regulation also sets out the further obligations of manufacturers, such as carrying out a conformity assessment procedure and affixing the CE mark to the product.

Its purpose is to ban certain hazardous substances from electrical and electronic equipment. The RoHS Directive restricts the use of certain substances in electrical and electronic equipment. These include substances such as lead, mercury, cadmium, and chromium, as well as certain brominated flame retardants and plasticizers. The listed substances may only be used in electrical and electronic equipment up to a maximum concentration value, unless an exemption can be claimed for them in accordance with the annexes to the directive. The associated elimination of harmful substances is intended to improve the recycling of waste electrical and electronic equipment and reduce the harmful effects on humans and the environment.

The consolidated version of the RoHS Directive was implemented in Germany by the Electrical and Electronic Equipment Substances Ordinance (ElektroStoffV).

We confirm compliance with the restrictions on use, the implementation of conformity assessment procedures, and the affixing of the CE mark in accordance with the legal requirements.
